Residential Onsite Sewage System Rule 410 IAC 6-8.3-53(a) states: The owner or agent of the owner shall obtain a written permit, signed by the health officer, for construction of a residential onsite sewage system prior to the start of construction of a residence; placement of a residence; construction or placement of an outbuilding that includes plumbing; replacement of a dwelling or outbuilding that includes plumbing; expansion or remodeling of a residence which may increase the number of bedrooms or daily design flow of an onsite sewage system.
