

exists for the making of the additional appropriation as requested by the Board of Trustees of said Fulton County Hospital, and the Board of Commissioners of the County of Fulton; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Fulton County Council:

Section 1. That the action of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Fulton in adopting an ordinance herein above set out be and the same is hereby approved and adopted by the Fulton County Council as fully and to the same extent as if said ordinance had been originally presented and approved or adopted by said Council.

Section 11. That there be and is hereby appropriated out of the proceeds of the County bonds heretofore authorized and approved to be issued by said County in the sum of Five Hundred Fifty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$558,000.00) for the use of the Board of Trustees of said Fulton County Hospital, commonly known as Woodlawn Hospital, for application on the costs of enlarging and improving the Fulton County Hospital, including the construction and equipping of an addition thereto and providing that said appropriation shall also cover all incidental expenses necessary to be incurred in connection with said project and in connection with the authorization and issuance of the bonds on account thereof, which expenses shall be deemed to be a part of the costs of said project.

This ordinance read and considered on the first reading by the Fulton County Council on February 15th, 1954, and again read, considered, and finally adopted on this 16th day of February, 1954.
