FULTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS Monday, April 5, 2021

Meeting Called to Order at 9:00 a.m. with Pledge to the Flag. Present: Rick Ranstead, Steve Metzger, County Attorney Holli Shorter-Pifer and Deputy Auditor Chantal Rensberger.

CORONER – Jeri Good reported that the ultimate lift that was purchased for the new office will need to be installed. The quote is \$3,300 and is slated to be installed in June. She will do an additional appropriation to cover the cost. The new vehicle conversion should be finished within the next month. She would like to have the vehicle marked once returned.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT – John Geier presented permits for consideration. Permit 21-3 from Elton Weaver on 600 N for a ditch. This permit was previously tabled and is returned for reconsideration. Rick motioned to approve, Steve seconded; carries 3-0. Permit 21-11 from BSM would like to bore for fiberoptic on Sweetgum Road. Steve motioned to approve, Rick seconded; carries 3-0. Permit 21-12 from Tom Bearss for a road bore for 8" tole on 375 W 1100 feet north of 200 S. Rick motioned to approve, Steve seconded; carries 3-0. Permit 21-13 from Precision Utilities Group requests boring under 400 N at 8175 W to install service. Rick motioned to approve, Steve seconded; carries 3-0. John updated on department activities including brush cutting being completed for the season, grading, patching and changing culverts. An RFP was put out for county-wide bridge inspections and are due Friday, April 9th. Bryan will review. John presented a contract with Midwest Spray Team for \$50/large structure, \$40/small structure. Rick motioned to approve, Steve seconded; carries 3-0. There is a problem with beavers under the bridge on Bessmore Park Road. The Lake Association does not want to pay for the maintenance; it is agreed that the highway department will cover the maintenance. There is a 4-ton culvert that is several years old that he would like to dispose of. At the current rate of scrap the estimated value is \$700. He would like to sell the culvert to a buyer who has offered \$900. Commissioners approve. The army truck was sold at auction for \$6,000. Bryan discussed planning for clearing brush in the right-of-way Glaze Hill (on Old US 31 N) in the next few years.

IT/MAINTENANCE – Josh Sriver reported that he is planning for updating the county website with a complete redesign. Commissioners reported that there have been several compliments on the courthouse lawn.

SHERIFF – Chris Sailors delivered the monthly reports. The department will be participating in stop-arm violation enforcement using grant funds and will increase patrols near schools for the next few weeks. Construction on the jail is now moving forward on the interior. He is gathering quotes for furniture.

COMMUNICATIONS – Gail Karas reviewed the monthly reports. She reviewed the quote for furniture for the new office. She announced that she will be going to Clark County tomorrow to present a Dispatch Hero award. There will be a BZA meeting for the tower on April 14.

FIDLAR CONTRACT – The County Recorder submitted a contract with Fidlar to be funded using the Recorder's Perpetuation Fund. The contract is for scanning of all of the old index books as they are handled the most and are getting damaged beyond repair. The contract in the amount of \$7,594.00 was motioned for approval by Rick, seconded by Steve; carries 3-0.

MINUTES – Meeting minutes from February 22, March 15 executive session, and March 15 regularly scheduled meeting were motioned for approval by Steve, seconded by Rick; carries 3-0.

OLD BUSINESS – The mask mandate will expire at midnight tonight. Rick motioned that the County reduce masks to an advisory, Steve seconded. Bryan added that the department head should decide if they would like to require in their respective offices, the county as a whole will reduce the status to a mask advisory. Rick discussed that the County will need to write a plan in order to receive the American Rescue Plan grant funds. Not enough information is available at this time. Bryan discussed House Bill 1381 concerning commercial wind and solar control with Russell Phillips. Mr. Phillips was present and commented that it was approved by the State committee last Thursday and would like to know what position the Commissioners take. Bryan stated that the position of the Commissioners is against the bill (removing local control for commercial wind and solar farms). Mr. Phillips summarized the contents of the bill and expressed his concern with county involvement. He is concerned with the ordinance that was written three years ago in regards to WEX.
